



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#### Introduction

Thank you for your purchase of a Gared Sports model 155655941 mat lock strap package. To ensure that our equipment will provide years of use to you, we are including this installation, operation, and maintenance guide. This guide will provide information on the proper assembly and installation methods, operating procedures, and preventative maintenance of your safety device.

It is recommended that an individual who has been properly trained perform assembly and set up of the mat hoist. No one under the age of 18 should attempt assembly or set up of the unit, unless properly supervised.

To prevent normal wear and tear from shortening the life of the unit, preventative maintenance inspections should be performed at least once per year. If the units are subject to high or unusual usage, inspections should be scheduled to occur more frequently. If items are found to be nonconforming, replacements can be ordered from Gared Sports or one of our authorized dealers. When contacting Gared Sports, please have information regarding the dealer/installer who sold the unit, the name of the project, and any applicable warranty information.







Read and understand the following warnings to prevent possible personal injury and potential damage to the equipment during assembly, setup, and operation.

# **A WARNING**

Failure to follow proper installation procedures can result in damage to mat storage system and safety lock. During installation remove all weight from load bar.

## **A** CAUTION

Safety lock is not a replacement for safe operation of mat storage system. During operation NO ONE should be under or around or near the device.

Before proceeding with assembly, read all instructions and assembly procedures. Make sure all parts have been received and are not damaged.






## Parts Checklist

#### **INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Make sure all weight on the load bar has been removed before you start installation. Run the load bar all the way up to the sub I beam assembly.
- 2. Place 805651568 Beam Clamp Top Weldment on top of I beam in location illustrated in Figure 1 on each end of the I beam.



3. Make sure that the plate is sitting flat on I beam, captured between the welded plates as shown in figure 2.



4. Install items 5 and 7. Don't tighten these bolts fully, as some adjustment may be required later in the set up (see figure 3)



5. Slide lower weldment under top plate. Align the holes and assemble using 3/8" bolts. You may need to use a screwdriver to help align the holes, as a tight fit is needed for this interface. Tighten these bolts fully, as it will be difficult to access the nuts once the 1100 units are installed.



6. Make sure all eight 3/8-16 bolts are tightened to final torque before moving on to next step.



7. Mount 1100 safe stop units using items 6, 9, & 10 making sure to place the washer with the nylon lock nut as shown in figure 6. NOTE: there may be components in the 1100 box that are not used. This is normal.






8. Pull the strap from the 1100 safe stop and wrap it around the load bar. Slide the securing clip around the belt and place the spacer and bolt through the belt loop such that the belt is captured in the clip (Figure 9).



- 9. Pull the straps tightly against the load bar. This will keep the loop assemblies from moving during operation and keeping them prepared to catch the load bar at any time.
- 10. Once one side is complete and installed, repeat procedure on the other end of the I beam.

WHEN INSTALLATION IS COMPLETE THERE SHOULD BE (4) STRAPS ATTACHED TO THE LOAD BAR.



### Maintenance

Twice a year the straps should be checked for wear. Check for any indications of fraying of belt. Also make sure they are all retracting into their housings without slack.





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
